A guide to organising a race night



Bring your community together for a fun filled evening and host a race night to raise vital funds for Children's Hospice South West (CHSW). Every penny raised directly helps the babies, children and young people we support, and their families.

Before your event

Venue. Choose a suitable venue, this could be a pub, village hall, community centre, school, college or meeting room at work. Try and source it for free so there's no additional costs.

Choose somewhere that is easily accessible, has plenty of parking and seating available, and kitchen facilities if you plan to offer food and drink.

Date. Make sure the date is suitable for the time of year and doesn't clash with other events in the area. Give yourself enough time to organise and promote the event. Be sure to share the event details with your family, friends, and colleagues.

Prizes. Try and get prizes donated - ask CHSW for a Letter of Authority so you can approach local businesses for prizes. You will give prizes for the winners of each race.

Tickets. Decide on an appropriate ticket price. Ideally sell tickets in advance to help with your planning.

Licences. Race nights are covered by the Gambling Commision Act. For more information, search 'race nights' on www.gamblingcommission.gov.uk

All money must be given to a worthwhile cause such as a charity. Check with your venue if your event requires any licences such as to sell alcohol.

Health and Safety. Please ensure you discuss health and safety and insurance requirements with your chosen venue.

Boost your fundraising

- Organise a raffle ask CHSW for a Letter of Authority so you can approach local businesses for prizes
- ⑤ If your venue allows, set up a tuck shop and drinks station where people can purchase refreshments before the race starts
- Double your money ask your team of helpers if they work for a bank or company that offers matched funding and if they do, ask them to apply to support your fundraising
- ⑤ Think about getting your event/races sponsored by a local business, as this will help cover costs and help you raise more
- ② Does your event need a programme? If so, why not sell advertising space to local businesses
- ② Ask family and friends who can't make the event to consider donating instead.

Promoting your event

There are lots of ways to spread the word about your event, here are a few ideas:

- Set up a Facebook event, share and ask followers to do the same. Remember to tag CHSW so we can see what you're up to and say thank you!
- Share your event into local Facebook groups to get the wider community engaged
- © Create posters and flyers with the event details, and place them around your local town. There is a template at the end of this guide for you to use
- © Ask family, friends and colleagues to come to the event and bring their friends along too
- Send your event details to your local newspaper and radio to help spread the word
- © Add your event to your local 'What's on' guide.

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© People and resources

You are likely to need a merry band of volunteers to help you on the night. Roles and equipment may include:

- © People to meet and greet, and someone on the door to sell and take tickets or money
- © We recommend a number of people to help take bets and calculate winnings
- © People to sell raffle tickets to guests and draw the winning tickets
- © Refreshment servers
- © Compere
- Prize organiser
- A technical coordinator to play the race and get everyone comfortably seated
- © Think about what equipment you might need, for example a PA system, microphone, projector and screen to show the race
- ³ We also have various CHSW branded items you can use, such as bunting, banners, collection tins and buckets - please ask CHSW in advance for any of these.

Ouring your event

- Arrive early to set everything up
- © Consider planning an interval to draw the raffle, and sell additional refreshments to boost your fundraising
- © Plan a moment during the evening to say a few words about Children's Hospice South West, why you have chosen to support us, and if you know, announce how much you have or hope to raise. This is a great opportunity to thank everyone for their support. We can provide you with a few bullet points if you aren't sure of the right words to say about the charity.

(a) After the event

- ② Pay all donations to Children's Hospice South West as soon as you can. You can do this online, send a cheque in the post or take cash to your local hospice
- © Return any supporter items to the hospice like collection tins or buckets
- We will send you a thank you letter and certificate so you can let guests and volunteers know how much they helped you to raise, this is a great way to thank them again!
